Originally built in 1852, **The Sir George Hotel** has been thoughtfully restored to offer warm hospitality and luxury accommodation, dining and shopping.

**Right beside the Murrumbidgee** and with its very own swim spot, **Jugiong Recreation Park** is one of NSW's most pleasant - and affordable - camping or caravan sites; just leave a gold coin in the donations box to help with upkeep of the park.

**Ever popular and very pet friendly, Jugiong Motor Inn** has a great little bar and restaurant with a-la-carte dining, set amidst a beautifully manicured garden on five acres where you can find hand raised farm animals and two young alpacas for company.



**For a country home away from home, Geralda Cottage Jugiong** is a lovely, rustic farmhouse surrounded by gorgeous rural views, within a very short walking distance of Jugiong pool, the Murrumbidgee and village life.



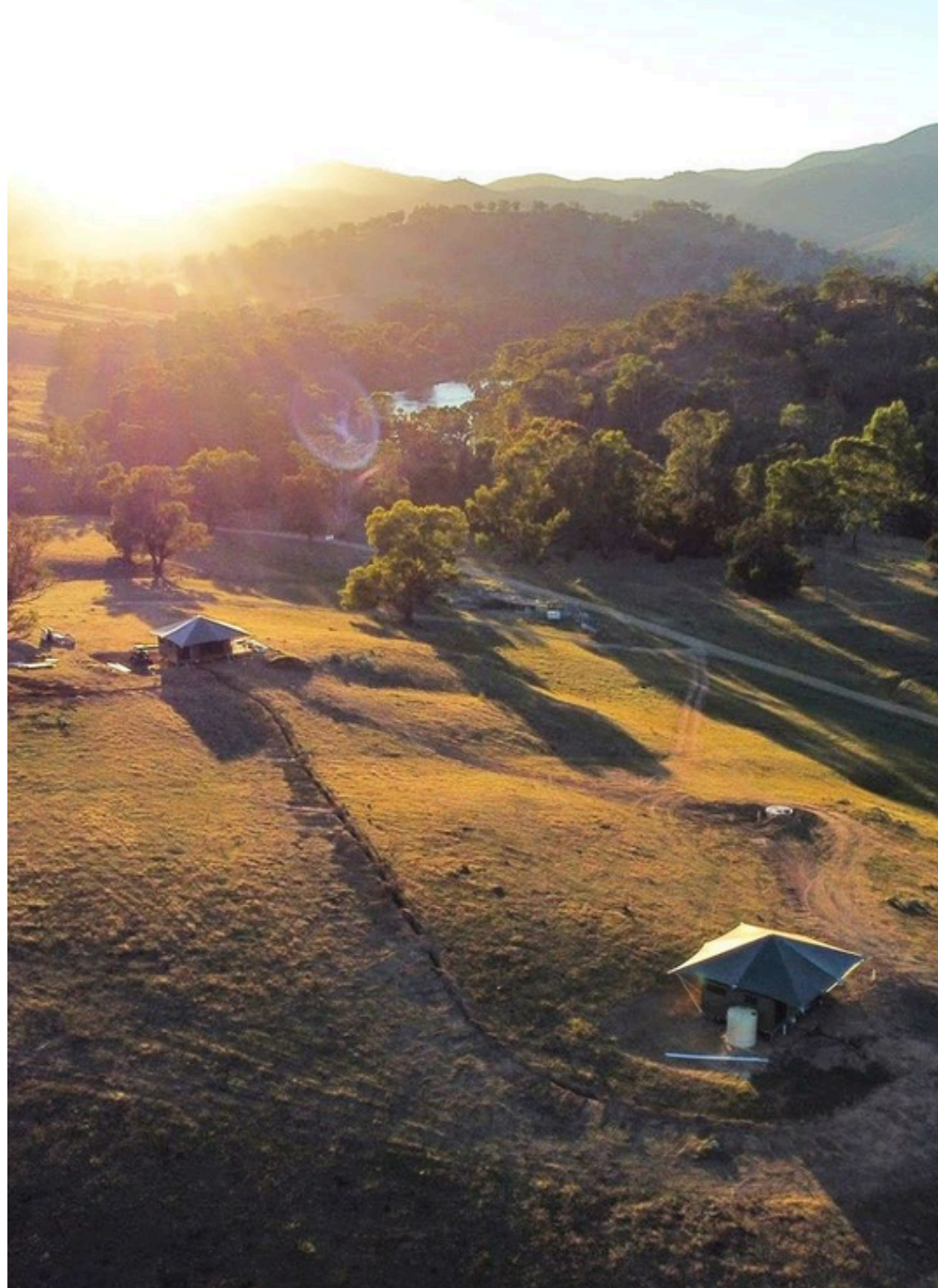


## Travel a little further afield

As well as fantastic country-lux accommodation, **The Sir George** offers space for guests or visitors to settle in and enjoy a cozy afternoon in the Whisky Lounge, try a leisurely lunch in the beer garden or boutique restaurant, or grab some take away. Guests can even order from a special '**à la bark**' menu for four-legged friends.

The Sir George philosophy is to showcase the best of fresh, local and seasonal produce, plus there are take-home pantry items from the kitchen, and for retail therapy there's the rustic Potting Shed in the grounds for gardening fans or the beautiful Curators Collective, which features a fantastic selection of homewares, fashion and unique furniture pieces. All this, plus a variety of artisanal stalls, food and entertainment are all available at the quarterly **Sir George Markets**.



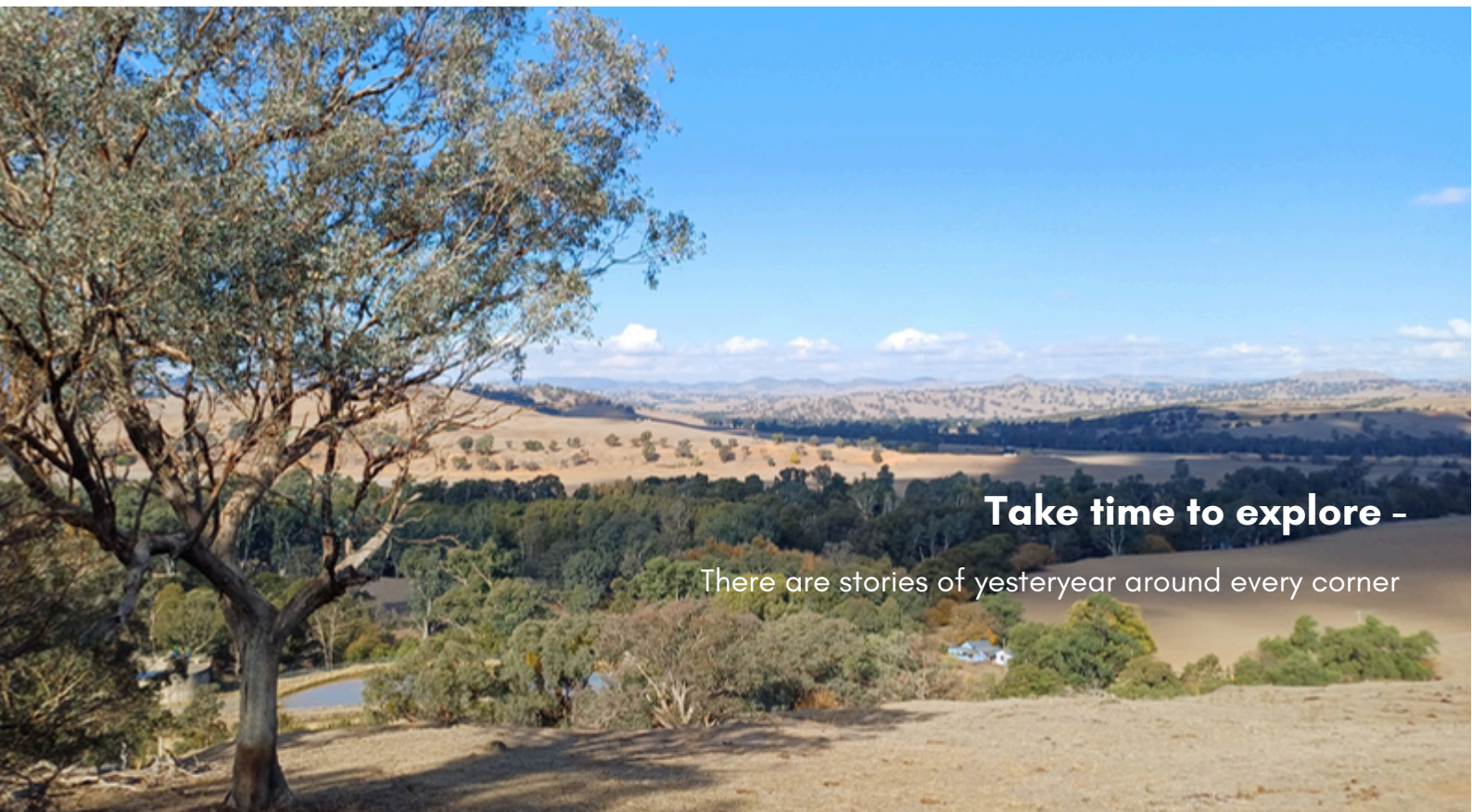

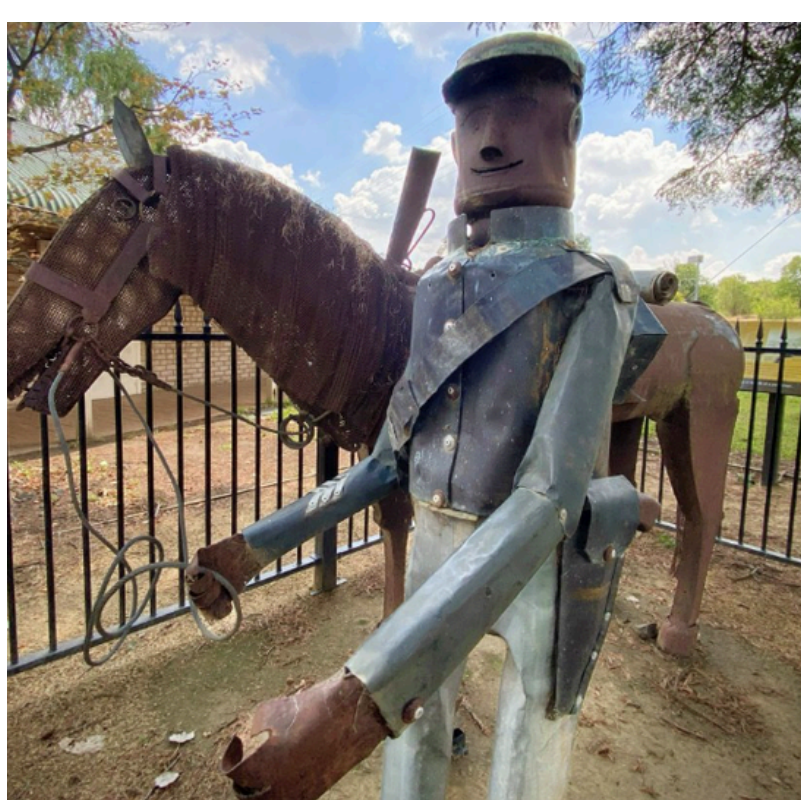
**Take time to explore -**

There are stories of yesteryear around every corner

A handcrafted memorial to Gundagai policeman, **Sergeant Edmund Parry** stands in the heart of Jugiong, a sombre reminder of the Region's wild colonial days.

On 16 November 1864, infamous bushrangers **Johnny Gilbert, Ben Hall** and **John Dunn** held up the mail coach between Gundagai and Jugiong and in the ensuing melee, Johnny Gilbert shot and killed 32-year-old Sergeant Parry, who was riding as part of an armed escort with Sub Inspector O'Neill (Gundagai) and Constable Roche (Yass). Both Constable Roche and Sub Inspector O'Neill survived.

Johnny Gilbert was killed by police a year later and is buried at nearby Binalong.



With extraordinary views across the Murrumbidgee, Jugiong, and part of the broader Hilltops Region's countryside and bush, the **Waterworks Lookout, Jugiong** is not to be missed.

The lookout has seating and a picnic table with ample room for parking and is close to the village, parks and other amenities.

**Be astounded by the variety and colour of the Hilltops towns and villages.**

While staying in Jugiong, enjoy a curated wine trail throughout the Hilltops with Craft My Escapes, and taste the range of Hilltops Wine Region's cool climate varieties - the sumptuous, historic Hilltops' Region awaits!
